Master of Arts in Political Science (MAPS)

Advance Your Career in Government, Education, or Non-Governmental Organizations

Our MAPS program is designed to equip students with the knowledge and skills needed for successful careers in government, education, non-governmental organizations, or further academic pursuits.

Choose from three specialized concentrations to tailor your education to your career goals:

- American Government: Gain a deep understanding of U.S. political institutions and the behavior of public and political actors. This concentration prepares you to analyze and engage with key issues in American politics and governance.
- International Relations: Explore the complexities of global politics by studying the institutions, behaviors, and interactions of foreign governments, transnational actors, and global systems. This concentration equips students to navigate and influence international affairs.
- Environmental Politics & Policy Analysis: Dive into an interdisciplinary curriculum that combines political science, public policy, and economics to address environmental challenges. Develop the analytical tools and concepts necessary to understand and shape environmental policy at both domestic and international levels.



Application Essentials

Standardized Exam Waiver Eligibility - The Cratis D. Williams School of Graduate Studies does not require official standardized exam scores (e.g., GRE, GMAT, MAT) for admission.

Admission Requirements - To be considered for admission, applicants must submit the following:

- Completed Application: Submit a formal application to the Cratis D. Williams School of Graduate Studies.
- Statement of Intent: Provide a written statement outlining your academic and professional goals.
- **Resume:** Submit a current resume detailing your academic and work experience.
- Letters of Recommendation: Provide three letters of recommendation from academic or professional references (two letters required for admissions from Fall 2025 onward).
- Academic Credentials: A baccalaureate degree with a minimum GPA of 2.75 (a GPA of 3.2 for admissions from Fall 2025 onward), or an earned graduate degree from an accredited institution.
- **Proof of English Proficiency:** Required for international students (e.g., TOEFL, IELTS). The TOEFL/IELTS requirement can be waived for students who have attended a U.S. institution.

Accelerated Admission Option - Undergraduate students currently enrolled at Appalachian State University with a GPA of 3.4+ are eligible to apply for the **Accelerated Admission Option** in the MAPS program.



Appalachian State University's Department of Government & Justice Studies offers undergraduate programs in political science and criminal justice, and graduate programs in political science and public administration.
